The college Library has been equipped with broadband internet connectivity which enables the students and teachers to avail the facility. A separate reading room for teachers and students have been inaugurated to provide better facility to students as well as to teachers.

#### 22. New Books/Journals subscribed and their cost :-

The Library has **19,955** books and standard journals are being subscribed for use by students and teachers. Department wise catalogues/stock registers are being updated. For the period 2013-14, **458** books and 17 journals have been procured. Out of total **1,80,000** from UGC grant and 2,00,000 from college grant.

# 23. Courses in which students assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback :-

Evaluation of teachers is done by students feedback on five point scale. The students submit feedback form to assess the performance of faculties class room teaching. On the basis of feedback, the principal caution to the concerned teachers having poor performance where ever necessary.

# 24. Computerization of admission and the process of admissions and examination results, issues of certificates :-

Administration work of college is partly computerised. The salary bill of the staff is fully computerised i.e. through HRMS (Human Resource Management System). Other than the salary component, accounting procedure of the college is carried out manually. Examination section is fully computerised. Mark Sheets and Provisional certificates are issued by the university after the publication of examination result.

#### 25. Increase in the infrastructural facilities :

The college has developed some infrastructural facilities for the already existing academic blocks during past 5 years. The laboratories to some extent fulfil the need of the student. Laboratories equipments are adequate for the need of the students. Generators, Water Purifier, Fire Extinguisher have been installed.

#### 26. Computer and Internet access and training to teachers and students.

Some of the practical teaching departments have computer with internet access. The teachers as well as students make use of the computer for making power point preparations, preparing seminar papers and project / dissertation.

The college have a student welfare fund. Every year the college extended help to poor meritorious students either to continue study or filling up form.

Most of the departments conduct parent-teacher meeting on a regular basis in order to provide feedback to the parents about the performance of their wards. Parents are invited for discussions or counselling in order to find solutions for problems faced by individual students.

Govt. Capital Hospital is adjacent to our college. So, in campus health services facilities are not available.

#### 31. Performance in sports activities:-

We believe in the importance of Physical fitness along with education. Our college has its own department of Physical education headed by P.ET. The dept. is solely responsible for the sports, games (outdoor/indoor). All students are encouraged to participate in inter college, and National sports Meet with all support.

The selection Committee of sports council of University selected our students to participate in National games. Besides our college hosts inter college Kabadi, Kho-Kho tournament organised by Utkal University.

#### 32. Incentives to outstanding sports persons :-

Outstanding sports persons are felicitated in Annual athletic Meet and Annual Day celebrations of the college with trophy and certificates.

#### 33. Student Achievement and Awards:-

One student of B.SC(H) secured 2nd position in inter college Essay Competition and one student of B.A.(H) secured 3rd position in inter college Mono action competition.

One student of Anth(H) stood first in University examination. She was felicitated on the Annual Day celebrations.

#### 34. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling Cell

The members of the each (Hons) teaching department advise the students regarding their academic and employment career. Even after leaving the portals of this college the alumini constantly keep touch with the college and take advises. This is a healthy practice followed by the institution.

#### 35. Placement services provided to students:-

Our college instituted one placement cell since 2011. Two senior Readers from the college are in charge of the Cell. Every year various companies, industries and institutes came to our college to recruit students on and off campus. Placement cell is a recruiting ground for them. Students receive personal advices for their career plan.

UGC funded Merger scheme entry to services provided a good opportunity in this context.

#### 36. Development programme for Non-Teaching Staff :-

Accounts training to Non-Teaching staff are being provided by Govt. of Orissa, in Madhusudan Academy of Accounts. Besides Data Entry Operator underwent training at OCAC for online admission under Students Academic Management(SAM) Computer Operation training has been imparted to nonteaching staff for preparation of salary bill, IT, through Human Resource Management System(HRMS).

#### 37. Good Practices of the Institution :-

To develop the overall personality of the students the college takes care by providing facilities for their mental, moral and intellectual development through nation-building activities like literary, cultural activities, social work etc. The college visualises the moulding of an ideal society firmly based on moral and ethical values and on philosophy and vision of the great educationists, so that our students would be intellectually accomplished, morally awakened and socially committed when they leave the institution.

Besides the college observes some healthy practices inside the college. The Principal maintains direct rapport with the student, parents, teaching and nonteaching staff. They have an easy access to the principal in case of any need or solution for any problem. The college is wedded to quality-based education to students and prepare them to accept the challenges of science and technology in the era of globalisation.

The college maintains transparency in admission process. The total admission procedure is monitored by Orissa Computer Application Centre(OCAC). The detailed merit list is uploaded in dhe.orissa.in web-site. Further, the selected candidate for admission is alerted through SMS. College calendar briefed everything about the rules and regulations of the college and mentally prepare the students to be opt their studies in all earnestness. The performance of the students is assessed through various tests during the academic session.

Each Hons. teaching department organises seminars to improve their communication skills. Welcome to fresher's and Farewell meets by the students are held with utmost discipline and in a pleasant atmosphere. The students came to college every day with their proper uniform.

The conduct of seminars, workshops, science exhibitions etc. also help the teachers to assess the overall performance of the students. Added to this extramural Lecturers by eminent teachers are arranged to infuse confidence among the students, that the class room teaching alone will not make a complete person. Literary competition like essay writing, debate, quiz and cultural events like dance, drama, music, songs etc/ are also organised and winners gave away, prizes in Annual Day Meet.

As a part of curriculum the Final year Anth(H) students are pursuing twenty days field work in a tribal village under the guidance of a teacher guide.

Various topics are assigned to the students by taking into account present crisis situation of tribals.

Steps are taken for all round development of students' personality, civic and social responsibilities among students. These character building aspects are also inculcated through a variety of programmes that are undertaken by the students. Besides, the college implemented various outreach programme viz. clean and green environment, AIDS awareness programmes, blood donation camps which will go a along way in development of a sense of social service, community living, friendship, environmental awareness and civic consciousness. This is how the college has been straining to bring out the latest qualities in the students and shaping them into all round personality when they go out to join the outside world to make a living.

- Infrastructural facilities will be enhanced to cater the needs of the students.




